(1st) Company I having been transferred to the 2nd Regiment Texas Cavalry April 22, 1862, and became Company B. (1st) Company K, 14th Regiment Texas Infantry, was transferred to this regiment soon after the muster of October 31, 1862, and became (2d) Company I. A part of this regiment was captured at Arkansas Post, Ark., January 11, 1863, and exchanged east of the Mississippi River in April and May, 1863, when it was consolidated with similar remnants of the 18th, 24th and 25th Regiments Texas Cavalry. This consolidation was broken up in March, 1864, when these parts of the 17th and 18th Regiments Texas Cavalry were united to form one field organization, but each appears to have been mustered separately.
