The 7th (also known as Gregg's) Regiment Texas Infantry was organized November 2, 1861, at Hopkinsville, Ky., with nine companies. A to I, which had previously been mustered into service for three years or the war. It was captured at Ft. Donelson, February 16, 1862, released at Vicksburg, Miss., about September 20, 1862, and disbanded at Aiken's Landing, Va., December 10, 1862. It was temporarily consolidated with the 10th and the 11th (Brown's) Regiments Tennessee Infantry from January 1, 1863, to about February, 1863, and formed Halley's Consolidated Regiment of Infantry. Company K was organized January 10, 1863, and Company P was disbanded in May, 1863. On April 1, 1863, this regiment became Companies B and C of the 1st (Grigsby's) Battalion, which was formed by the consolidation of Grigsby's Brigade, and was paraded at Greensboro, N. C., about May 1, 1863.

The 7th (also known as Halleys) Regiment Texas Infantry was organized November 9, 1860, at Hopkinsville, Ky., with nine companies, A to I, which had previously been mustered into service for three years or the war. It was captured at Ft Donelson February 14, 1862, released at Vicksburg, Miss., about September 20, 1862, and declared exchanged at Aiken's Landing, Va., November 10, 1862. It was temporarily consolidated with the 56th Brown's Tennessee Infantry from December 8, 1862, to about February, 1863, and formed Halleys Consolidated Regiment of Infantry. Company K was organized January 10, 1863, and Company F was disbanded in May, 1863. Until April 9, 1863, this regiment, because Companies H and I of the 7th were lost, became Companies H and I of the 2nd Texas Brigade and was paraded at Greensboro, N. C., about May 1, 1863.

It was captured at Ft Donelson, February 14, 1862, released at Vicksburg Miss., about September 20, 1862, and declared exchanged at Aiken's Landing, Va., November 10, 1862. It was temporarily consolidated with the 10th and the 35th - Brown's, Regiments Tennessee Infantry from October 8, 1862, to about February, 1863, and formed Halleys Consolidated Regiment of Infantry. Company K was organized February 10, 1863, and Company F was disbanded in May, 1863. About April 9, 1863, this regiment became Company Hand C of the Regiment which was formed by the consolidation of Granbury's Texas Brigade and was paraded at Greensboro, N. C., about May 1, 1863.
