ON this the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August A. D. 1863 before me, BIRD FITZPATRICK, Judge of the Court of Probate in and for said County and State, personally appeared Mary Revel, of Pike County,

and made oath on the Holy Evangelly of Almighty God, that she was the mother of Shepard W Revel a Private of Captain A. P. Loves (certificate of Capt Enrolled) "Co I" 22<sup>nd</sup> Regiment Alabama Volunteers, and that her said Son died at

Corinth Mississippi on or about the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February A. D. 1862, leaving between the 1<sup>st</sup> & 12 of Feb 1862 no wife or child to inherit his pay or wages, except this affiant his mother, and that she is therefore entitled to receive the arrears of pay, &c., that may be found due her deceased Son S. W. Revel from the Confederate States.

And at the same time also appeared Stephen G Gannus and made oath that he is acquainted with the said Mary Revel and knew her said son Shepard W Revel deceased, and that the facts as sworn to by the said Mary Revel are true, and that he is not interested in this claim.
